# A FAIRY-TALE VISION REALISED

Neuschwanstein Castle seems like a whimsical dream manifested in stone, where historical nostalgia meets modern ingenuity, leaving visitors enchanted by its story and splendour. Commissioned by King Ludwig II of Bavaria in 1869, it stands as an architectural testament to Romanticism and 19th-century historicism. Perched high in the Bavarian Alps, the castle was originally conceived as a private retreat filled with art, Ludwig's ingenious inventions and secret passageways, with diverse influences spanning from Wagner's operas to medieval mythology. Ludwig's deep fascination with swans and chivalric ideals infuses the design, underscoring his legacy as the 'Swan King'.

Designed by Christian Jank and constructed by Eduard Riedel and Georg von Dollmann, the castle's eclectic architecture combines Romanesque, Gothic and Byzantine influences. Despite being unfinished at Ludwig's untimely death in 1886, its silhouette and innovative amenities have become synonymous with his uniquely visionary spirit. Remarkably, just a few weeks after his passing in 1886, the castle opened to the public. Today, it is one of the most visited castles in the world, inspiring countless works of art, films and pop culture.




## MEDIEVAL MEETS MODERN ARCHITECTURE

The interior design in the original parts of the castle famously combines historic references mixed with contemporary art and all the groundbreaking technology and amenities for its time. Modern toilets with flush systems, an electric call system to summon servants and central heating systems all showcase Ludwig's extravagant taste for advanced design and comfort. We included familiar details found in both the Throne Room and Ludwig's apartment, so keep an eye out for references as you build.

The Byzantine-inspired splendour is seen in the Throne Room, famous for its elaborate mosaics and gilded arches. Although designed to hold a majestic golden throne, Ludwig was deposed before it could be installed, leaving an empty space at the top of the grand staircase.







## FROM THE LEGO® ARCHITECTURE DESIGN TEAM

The LEGO landscape in the model is designed to allow for a quick progression while still retaining the detail of the rugged natural setting. 

We aimed to capture the various turrets, chimneys, staircases and gabled roofs with the utmost accuracy, while a record number of new, printed graphic decorations (237!) capture the various signature windows that adorn the buildings. The model includes a full extra set of deciduous trees, giving you the option to display it with a summery, green, gradient colour scheme OR an autumnal, yellow/orange/dark-red colour scheme. We hope that by building this model, you will feel inspired to visit – or revisit – this magnificent castle.











A unique grotto, styled after the Hörselberg in the Tannhäuser legend, sits between the study and salon. This cave featured a waterfall and coloured lights.


